WELCOME TO OUR VISITORS

It's high summer and the City is emptying of its regular workers and in their place come an increasing number of tourists from home and abroad. They see the City through fresh eyes, comparing it to their own home cities; but we know it is different even when their cities are as old as ours. The mix of old buildings intermingle, sometimes rather uncomfortably, with high rise iconic redevelopments towering into the sky. It is then that the vision of Wren with his skyline punctuated by church spires and towers is diminished to some of us who appreciate a more domestic scale to the buildings around us. But gems still survive in their original perspective. Think of **St Martin Ludgate** deliberately placed along the sight line along Ludgate Hill leading to St Paul's west front. Or **All Hallows London Wall**, apparently sheltering indeed on the wall and defying the busy traffic on London Wall the roadway. At the other end of the spectrum is a church like **St Ethelburga** peeping out from between its over reaching neighbours - newly rebuilt and so easy to miss if walking along the east pavement of Bishopsgate, as its frontage is barely a house-width. But in earlier times it had shops in front of it just as **St Peter Cornhill** still does.

The City is a place to walk. Getting off the main thoroughfares and into the lanes, some of which retain their mediæval street pattern, is to wander in the footsteps of those who lived, worked and died here in past centuries. The church bells alerted them to the regular offices of the church, ringing in celebration for weddings or major national events, or muffled when a funeral took place. All mediæval cities will have an historic core of old churches and we are mightily blessed in the City, even more so than York, Norwich or Ipswich for example. Abroad, perhaps the nearest finest comparable city is Venice. We don't have the canals here but we do have the intimate street pattern and the plethora of fine churches around every corner. Venice too had problems with its historic overprovision of churches for modern needs, so many were closed except for services. There, an organisation called **Chorus**, *associazione per le chiesa del patriarcato di venezia*, has gradually extended its operations to look after a small number of the many churches, marketing them as a group, collating their literature and presentation and opening them for a fee, with an annual pass allowing one visit to each to encourage multiple visits - see its website www.chorusvenezia.org. Like the FCC here, they too focus on 15 churches. We work closely with the individual churches and the Archdeaconry of London to make sure that the 15 churches in which we Watch are always available for viewing at regular times as well as for services: see our website at www.london-city-churches.org.uk. We don't charge for entry and our watchers are volunteers; some of them come long distances into London to serve the City churches in this way. Many more contribute membership subscriptions to allow us to provide small grants for restoration works, pump-priming funds, postcards and other presentational material. We are embarking on a project to provide each of the Watched churches with a simple floor plan-based 3 fold A4 guide. All our Watched churches have a board outside publicising our presence on the day we are there. The Watchers within are knowledgeable and friendly and have cards listing the other churches we watch.
