AN UPSIDE-DOWN CHRISTMAS

Have you heard about the upside-down Christmas Tree? it is a fad, but some people are actually attaching their Christmas tree upside down with the base on the ceiling and the top hanging down in the middle of the room like an evergreen stalactite. It's novel, it saves space and it leaves more room for presents! There are however serious drawbacks, like how to water it!

The idea of an upside-down Christmas tree provokes a more serious point about Christmas itself, summed up in Mary's song of subversion which we call the Magnificat. It is a revolutionary song about God's upside-down values which Mary sang when she was told that she was going to give birth to the Saviour. A song about the little people being exalted and the mighty cast down, about the hungry poor being filled, and the rich are being sent away empty.

Mary sang about a new order of things. Her child was not to be a comfort, he was to be an intrusion, and that child was not born in marbled splendour, but in a smelly stable. One thing that we in the City cannot avoid this Christmas is the protest camp outside St Paul's Cathedral. Whatever our views about it, the presence of the protesters has made people talk about issues of justice, financial inequality, and the future of capitalism in a way that our politicians have failed to do. The humble poor have challenged the powerful and the mighty, and thankfully the Cathedral Chapter have begun a process of engagement, taking the issues forward, in the Bishop of London's words 'reconnecting the financial and the ethical'.

The ramshackle protest camp right next to the glorious beauty and majesty of St Paul's Cathedral makes an important statement about our upside-down Gospel message – the King born in a stable, God become human, a nobody becoming the mother of our Lord, the last coming first and the first last.

Christmas in the Bible is not like Christmas in a typical shopping centre, a winter wonderland of shopping and glitter and nostalgia. Christmas in the Bible is much more revolutionary. It connects the glory of St Paul's with the clamour of the camp and tells us that there is a deeper joy and a fuller life than most of us settle for most of the time. Thank God for the way the protest camp challenges us this Christmas to think about the mystery of the Incarnation and the upside-down values about which Mary sang in the Magnificat.

May I wish you all a joyful upside-down Christmas.
