THE HOLIDAYS ARE HERE

The month of July is now prime time for summer festivals – not least, in the Square Mile, the City of London Festival, which runs from 21st June to 9th July this year. In a time without ‘weekends’, let alone ‘holiday entitlement’, the working week was relieved largely by Sundays and Saints’ Days, so the grant of a spontaneous holiday was a powerful crowd-pleaser in the hands of benevolent employers or popular Lord Mayors.

When London looked to Rome, as did the whole of Western Europe for many centuries before the Reformation, the major festivals of the Church shaped both the commercial and the social year. Until September 1752, when the ancient Julian calendar was replaced by the present Gregorian one, the New Year began on 25th March, Lady Day (The Feast of the Annunciation), and was divided by the other Quarter Days – one cosmological, two religious - on Midsummer Day, Michaelmas (29th September) and Christmas. These were key dates for paying rent, hiring servants and settling debts, which must have taken the shine off the holidays for some, and linger still in much ancient law and practice.

As occasions for festivity, if not an actual holiday, the feast days of the saints would have been known to all. Major saints would be commemorated everywhere, but a city as rich in churches as pre-Fire London would also have seen numerous parish festivals throughout the year. Considering that the smallest parishes covered barely an acre of ground and reckoned their inhabitants by the dozen, many of these would have been more like block parties than street fairs, but as many churches shared dedications, any one saint’s feast day might be celebrated in several parishes around town. No less than 14 City churches were dedicated to the Virgin Mary, which must have provided much occasion for celebrations both pious and secular, as there are a good two dozen occasions on which to celebrate significant anniversaries in her life.

While the six churches once dedicated to St. Martin had to make due with a feast day on 11th November, a good number enjoyed summer festivals. July is well served by London dedications, ancient and modern, with St. Benedict (London’s ‘St. Benet’) on 11th July, St. Margaret on 20th July, St. Mary Magdalen on 22nd July, St. James the Great on 25th July, Sts. Joachim and Anne on 26th July and St. Olaf on 29th July. Although the Reformation, the rise of the Protestant work ethic and the rude interruption of the puritanical Commonwealth eventually put an end to many such old traditions, some lingered even into living memory. Even in an age of refrigerated transport, high summer is not the best of seasons for European oysters, but St. James’ Day was particularly noted for their consumption, in honour of his emblematic scallop. In the days when the streets of the City teemed with children, there was keen competition to build decorated grottoes (or, at least, sizeable mounds) of the discarded shells, and importune passing adults for small change, as some children still do with a Guy before Bonfire Night. Even in recession, hard-up merchant bankers have yet to revive this ancient City custom.

Everyone is invited to celebrate one modern City festival on Saturday 10th July, when the Friends of the City Churches’ annual City Churches Walks will see some two dozen churches open on a Saturday – a rare event indeed – with guided walks departing from St. Mary Aldermary (at Bow Lane, Mansion House Station) at 10:30 and 13:30, for £7 per person per half-day. What better way to celebrate the City Saints?
